Financial report

Club treasurer Pat Carden presented 2020/2021 financial accounts. Pat noted a healthy cashflow position for the club with balances across the three accounts up \$4,344 on prior year. This is partly due to:

- Grants: Aktive Network \$ 1000 in July 2020, \$ 4,500 in Sept 2020 many thanks to Tony Sangster for applying
- Tri NZ support for the Junior Academy \$4,063.96 July 2020 many thanks to Alison Feeney. This has enabled these activities to be self-funding and have meant that we haven't had to use the generous donation from Garth Barfoot for the juniors yet.
- Pukekohe Duathlon 2020: despite being unable to obtain help with expenses through a grant from Pub Charity, we still covered costs and made a small profit!

This healthy balance has enabled the club to provide branded cups, socks and bottles to all members and at the awards evening.

- Success of ACT in the Kohi Swim series
- Success of Tri NZ zwift racing league. ACT finished up 2nd position overall behind Tri Tauranga.
- Successful ACT Awards night at College Rifles Rugby Club (thanks to Jason Orr who organised the venue)
- Update of club kit

- Unfortunate cancellation of Pukekohe Duathlon due to COVID restrictions. Special thanks to Lynley Twyman for all her hard work with this event.
- Club communications continues with monthly newsletter. Scottie T has been instrumental in helping to increase our social media presence, including a members only facebook page.
- Increasing number of discounts being offered to members for both events and products.
- Continuing support of the Auckland Regional Youth Triathlon Academy, run by Nathan Richmond.
- Acknowledge the amazing role that Tony O'Hagan played in providing coaching support for members. Work is underway with other coaches to provide training options.

Setting of membership fees:

Membership fees to remain same as last year:

- \$75 for adults (21 and over)
- \$35 for juniors
- \$105 for families

The club would like to extend the junior fee to all members under 21 to enable tertiary students and early-career workers to be active members.

Setting of fees accepted by Cara Hair and seconded by Katie Gormley

Discussed the options for the ongoing funding of the Junior Academy. Previously TriNZ has funded Nathan Richmond (\$5,000) and covered his travel expenses but they are unable to continue their support. The ACT committee has agreed to continue this funding for the upcoming season but remain aware that, even with the healthy Junior bank balance, this is not sustainable indefinitely and therefore we need to consider other income streams. Jason Orr offered to investigate possible SportNZ funding aimed at supporting clubs during COVID times. Also discussed possibility of a one-off \$50 fee to join the academy but decision about this will wait until we know if we can secure a SportNZ grant and the exact financial demands of the academy for the season.
